He currently serves as the vice-chair of the Washington State Governor's Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS and holds masters degrees in social work and public health from the University of Washington.

About the Hosts

African Americans Reach and Teach Health (AARTH) Ministry is a faith-based nonprofit organization established to respond to HIV/AIDS and other major health issues affecting people of African descent through education, compassionate service, access to resources and self-advocacy for better health care systems. AARTH Ministry provides HIV health ministry development and training, HIV instructor certification, prevention and early intervention education and training services for churches/mosques and faith-based institutions that serve people of African descent.

The Northwest AIDS Education and Training Center (AETC), located at the University of Washington, offers HIV treatment education, clinical consultation, capacity building and technical assistance to health care professionals and agencies in Washington, Alaska, Montana, Idaho, and Oregon. As the epidemic disproportionately affects racial and ethnic minorities in the region, the Northwest AETC offers Minority AIDS Initiative programming specifically targeting minority providers, providers serving HIV-infected persons of color, and minority-specific community based organizations.

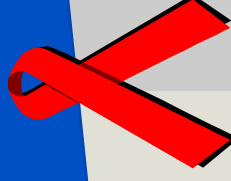

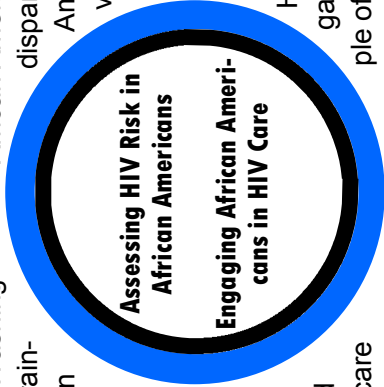

African Americans Reach and Teach Health (AARTH) Ministry and the Northwest AIDS Education and Training Center (NW AETC) at the University of Washington are hosting two HIV/AIDS trainings for clinical professionals. In May 2005, medical providers in Washington, Alaska, Montana, Idaho, and Oregon were surveyed regarding their training needs in working with African American patients. In the final analysis, assessing HIV risk and engaging African Americans in care were listed as useful trainings for medical

providers. Physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, and social workers will find these trainings useful in providing care to their African American patients and in reducing health disparities. Studies show that African Americans are less likely to have advance knowledge of an HIV diagnosis and are less likely to engage in care once they have been diagnosed. These trainings support the efforts of the Washington State Board of Health and others to help bridge the gap in health disparities affecting people of color by offering training that will increase the capacity of health care professionals.
